## **DIVERSITY (0-3 hr)** Select ONE course. This category permits overlap with another Gen Ed course.

The goal of courses in this category is to foster an understanding of the pluralistic nature of institutions, society, and culture. Students can choose a diversity focus of either Social Diversity in the U.S. or Global Diversity.

Courses: Social Diversity in the US courses are underlined as "\_\_\_". Global Diversity courses are underlined as "\_\_\_". All underlined courses in other categories will fulfill both that designated category and the Diversity category. Students who do not appropriately plan their coursework to fulfill one of their Gen Ed categories with a Diversity course will be required to take an additional course to fulfill their Diversity category.

## APPROVED GENERAL EDUCATION SUBSTITUTIONS

#### Foreign Language

Students pursuing a degree in the College of Engineering are not required to complete a foreign language category in their General Education. However, students who are interested in pursuing coursework in a foreign language are permitted the following approved substitutions:

- A. Foreign Language 1103 Course: credit (including EM) for a foreign language sequence through 1103, or credit for a foreign language course with a prerequisite of 1103, can be used to satisfy the Cultures & Ideas Gen Ed category.
- B. Foreign Language Minor Courses: completion of a foreign language minor permits a student to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the Gen Ed and minor. A curricular petition must be submitted to the student's program, which will forward it to the college for review. The courses must meet the spirit of the Gen Ed category for which overlap is requested.

#### **Contemporary World**

Students pursuing a degree in the College of Engineering are not required to complete a Contemporary World requirement in their General Education. However, students who are interested in completing a University-level Contemporary World course are permitted to the following approved substitution:
